It was also noted that the Chairman of the Board of Governors of the above corporation is Henry Morgenthau, Jr.

The Fashington Field Office is instructed to immediately contact the Foreign Agents Registration Section of the Department of Justice, and determine whether the captioned corporation has registered as an agent of a foreign principal.

The New York Office is instructed to immediately obtain two copies of the prospectus of the above-described bond issue and forward them to the Eureau.

The Abstract indicates that the principal is the Government of Israel - The American Financial and Development Corporation for the State of Israel - 2 Park Avenue, New York 16, New York. The principal's nationality was given as Israeli, and its business as Government. The Agency itself indicated that the Registrant would act as the principal advertising agency, placing advertisements in magazines and newspapers.

The nature of the agency is described as being the advertising agency of the foreign principal, placing advertisements in newspapers, magazines. As of the date of the filing of the statement, the following funds were received from the Government of Israel:

The statement also reflects expenditures by the agent in behalf of the principal for advertising, production charges, printing and artists.

A letter confirming the selection of HIRSHON-GARFIELD, INC., as the advertising agency for subject corporation was addressed to Dr. MARTIN_ROSENBLUTH, as the representative of the Government of Israel, on January 9, 1951, which letter was signed by SIENEY GARFIELD. By signature dated January 11, 1951, Dr. ROSENBLUTH accepted the arrangements.

PRIME MINISTER LAUNCHES ISRAEL BOND ISSUE

The State of Israel attaches supreme importance to the full success of its \$500,000,000 Independence Bond Issue. This was made clear with the arrival in the United States of David Ben Gurion, Prime Minister of Israel. In a visit to major American communities which takes him from New York to Los Angeles, the distinguished statesman is bringing to this country a picture of the problems, achievements and prospects of the three-year-old State.

On arrival in Washington, the Prime Minister met with the President of the United States, with Secretary of Defense Marshall, Secretary of State Acheson and other major personalities in the American Government to consider problems of mutual concern to the United States and Israel.

Mr. Ben Gurion's stay in New York City was the signal for an extraordinary outpouring of respect and affection from the great city. May 9 was declared "Ben Gurion Day" in the metropolis and one of the great ticker-tape receptions was accorded to the Israel Prime Minister, whom millions greeted in a demonstration unequalled in the history of the Jewish community. On the following day, a rally was staged at Madison Square Garden to mark the formal launching of the State of Israel Bond Drive. The Garden was crowded to capacity and 35,000 people were outside listening to the proceedings through loudspeakers.

Bond Subscriptions Honor Prime Minister

Before a limited group of several hundred of the national leaders in the Israel Bond Committees, Mr. Ben Gurion spoke of the importance of the productive development of Israel for its military security, physical growth and spiritual future. The function held on May 9 at the Waldorf-Astoria, was marked by the announcement of commitments for the purchase of Israel Bonds from those present.

One of the largest of the purchases was announced by William J. Levitt, who advised that the Levitt Foundation was subscribing to \$500,000 of Israel Bonds. Within twenty-four hours, the check for the purchase was transmitted to the American Financial and Development Corporation.

Jacob Blaustein, distinguished industrialist, and President of the American Jewish Committee, announced that the Blaustein family was purchasing \$250,000 of Israel Bonds.

Abe Kasle, Detroit industrialist, and Chairman of the 1951 Detroit Federation campaign, announced that the several members of the Kasle family who had previously committed themselves for \$160,000 of Israel Bonds were raising the commitment to \$250,000.

Other major purchasers who attended the dinner in honor of the Prime Minister included Rudolf G. Sonneborn, who increased his initial purchase from \$100,000 to \$125,000, Boris Margolin, \$100,000; Schaver family, \$75,000; Meyer Jaffe, of Fall River, \$125,000; Robert Gurney, Gastonia, N. C. \$200,000; George Levin, Newark, \$75,000; Jacob Sincoff, \$50,000; Dewey D. Stone, \$150,000; Barney Balaban, \$100,000; Joseph Cherner, who raised his previously announced commitment of \$300,000 to \$350,000; Samuel Rothberg family, \$525,000; Melvin Dubinsky, for himself and Harold Dubinsky, \$50,000; Abraham Goodman family, \$50,000; Morris Morgenstern, \$60,000; Joseph Levy, \$100,000; William Salzman, \$50,000; Andrew Geller, \$50,000; Albert M. Kahn, \$50,000.

It was announced also that the M. L. Annenberg Foundation, which is headed by Walter Annenberg, publisher of the Philadelphia Inquirer, was making an initial purchase of \$100,000 of Israel Dollar Coupon Bonds. Morris Berinstein, Chairman of the National Campaign Cabinet of the United Jewish Appeal, committed himself to \$25,000. Morris Senderowitz, Jr., who has accepted the Chairmanship for Israel Bonds in Allentown and the three surrounding communities, took \$100,000. On behalf of his family, Morris Shapiro of Boston announced \$100,000; Fred Monosson, \$55,000; Rabb family, Boston, \$100,000; Charles Frost, \$25,000; Joseph Holtzman and Mrs. Holtzman, Detroit, \$55,000; A. B. Joffe, \$55,000; Philip Lown, Maine, \$60,000; Harry Levine, \$50,000; Irving Norry, Rochester, \$25,000. A brief but touching speech was made by Julius Livingston, of Tulsa, when he described the deep emotion he felt as he witnessed the great parade for Israel's Prime Minister in New York. He subscribed for \$25,000.

OSNOS' \$100,000 STARTS DETROIT

It is good business -- in the financial and the Jewish sense -- to buy State of Israel Bonds. That is what Detroit's business leaders are saying to the community. As they bring to a close the annual Federation drive and shift the major part of their voluntary effort to Bonds for Israel, they are demonstrating with their own purchases and with their organizational activity the key importance which Israel Bonds have in the economic future of that country.

Max Osnos, Chairman of Detroit's Committee, started off with a \$100,000 commit-

ment. Abe Kasle also began with \$100,000 but substantially increased this at the dinner honoring Prime Minister Ben Gurion in New York on May 9. Joseph Holtzman announced \$50,000. As the first ten days of Detroit's bond activity closed, commitments already exceeded \$1,250,000.

What was especially important about Detroit purchases was that the so-called "little people" and not alone the "top people" were subscribing in new financial terms. Previous standards of financial participation in Jewish community affairs were obviously playing no part in the amount of Israel Bonds that individuals were buying for investment.

All sectors of the community were beginning to play a role. Thus, a special meeting in honor of Moshe Shapiro, Israel's Minister of Immigration, was tendered by the Mizrachi and Religious Groups. The result was the sale of \$400,000 of Israel Bonds. This segment of the community has set itself a goal of \$1,000,000. Its immediate objective for the Shapiro dinner was \$250,000. The ease with which this target was surpassed indicates how eager the community is for Israel Bonds. Irving Schlussel, President of Mizrachi, and Phillip Stollman, the group's Bond Chairman, were joined at the meeting by Abe Kasle to urge the importance of Bonds. The widespread nature of the leadership is indicated in the participation of Harry Sosnick and Morris Snow, respectively Bond Chairman and President of the B'nai Zion Congregation; Max Temchin, Continental Metal Co.; Charles Wolok, Hapoel Hamizrachi leader; Daniel Temchin, Chairman for Synagogues; Abe Nusbaum, Co-Chairman for Bonds.

The Labor Zionists of Detroit staged their own meeting, with Mrs. Golda Myerson, Israel's Labor Minister, as guest of honor. Bonds in the amount of \$178,000 were sold to a group which, if judged by previous financial comparisons, might not have been expected to do more than one seventh as well. Over 500 people crowded into the Labor Zionist Institute. Morris Lieberman and Harry Schumer presided and called for Bond purchases from a previously prepared list of their members. Among the major participants were Morris Schaver, Harry Schumer, B. M. Laiken, Nelson Brothers, William Hordes, Jacob Schreier, Harry Sott, Sol Kurtzman and Sid Shevitz.

Mrs. Moses Epstein, Chairman of the National Women's Division for Israel Bonds, who flew to Chicago for the function, served as sales co-ordinator and called out the purchases as they were made. The opening prayer was delivered by Mrs. Harry Iverson, President of the Conference of Jewish Women's Organizations.

Credit for the extraordinary turnout, one of the largest meetings of Jewish women's groups in the history of the Chicago community, goes to Mrs. Joseph Prochep, President of the National Council of Jewish Women. and her co-chairmen: Mrs. Carl Halperin, of Hadassah; Mrs. Evelyn Kaplan, President of Pioneer Women; Mrs. Morris L. Minkus, President of the American Jewish Congress Women's Division; Mrs. Anna Moskowitz, President of Mizrachi Women; Mrs. Maurice Nagle, President of the National Women's League; and Mrs. Saul Sterling, President of B'nai B'rith Women. Others who shared in the proceedings were Mrs. Sam Field, of the American Jewish Congress; Mrs. Bernard Gingold, of Pioneer Women; Mrs. Philip Lozowick, of the National Council of Jewish Women; Mrs. Sol Ross, Mrs. George Pohn and Mrs. Joseph Willens of Hadassah; and Mrs. Morris J. Silver, of B'nai B'rith Women.

SOUTH BEND SETS STANDARDS

At the first meeting to sell State of Israel Bonds in South Bend, Ind. a small group of purchasers started off with \$188,000 in Bonds. Largest of the initial purchases was made by the Ben Feferman Motor Sales Corp., which is headed by Ben, Henry and Max Feferman, who subscribed to \$75,000. Chairman of the South Bend Israel Bond Committee is Jack Köhen. A. C. Simon, Sam Brown and Albert M. Schulman are Co-Chairmen.

\$100,000 BEGINS FORT WAYNE BOND DRIVE

With commitments in excess of \$100,000, Meyer Ruchman, Chairman of the State of Israel Bond Committee in Fort Wayne, Ind., could report with pride at the dinner in honor of Prime Minister Ben Gurion at New York on May 9. Formerly General Chairman of the Ft. Wayne Federation, President of Synagogue B'nai Jacob, and head at various times of B'nai B'rith and Zionist District, Mr. Ruchman is President of the Indiana Rolling Mill Baling Corp. The Co-Chairman is Isidor Hassan, President of Hassan Barrel Co., and life-long Zionist and communal worker. Hon-

orary Chairmen are G. Irving Latz, II, and Dr. Nathan L. Salon. The Israel Bond Committee comprises Rabbi F. A. Doppelt, Rabbi J. A. Gorfinkel, Dr. Nat Gladstone, Abe Kaplan, Jacob Bernstein and Joseph Levine.

PITTSBURGH PASSES \$1,300,000 MARK

For the dinner on May 9 in honor of the Prime Minister of Israel, the Pittsburgh Israel Bond Committee reported subscriptions of \$1,300,000.

TRI-STATE AREA SHOWS \$407,000

With Robert Amper as Chairman for State of Israel Bonds in the Tri-State area centering round Pittsburgh, an intensive activity has been reported throughout the region. On May 9, subscriptions of \$407,100 were reported. The Johnstown, Pa. campaign started with a parlor meeting attended by Mr. Amper and Ben Paul Brasley, Chairman of Special Sales in Pittsburgh. David Glosser committed himself for \$50,000; Charles Lisowitz, Chairman, for \$25,000.

LABOR ORDER PRESSES ISRAEL BOND SALES

Meyer L. Brown, President, and Louis Segal, General Secretary of Farband - Labor Zionist Order, have been designated as Chairman and Secretary respectively of the National Bond Committee of the Labor Zionist fraternal organization. Mr. Brown has taken a leave-of-absence from his duties as Director of the Jewish Teachers' Seminary and is devoting his full time to the Bond Drive. The entire General Executive Committee of the organization has been constituted as a committee-of-the-whole for the Bond activity.

At a reception to Mrs. Golda Myerson marking the opening of the Farband's activities in New York City, commitments for the purchase of \$1,030,000 in Israel Bonds were recorded. The Farband activity is part of the united Bond Drive program of the Labor Zionist movement, which has pledged itself to sell a total of \$20,000,000 in Israel Bonds.

EMPLOYEES START PAYROLL DEDUCTION

The Jewish employees of Cosmopolitan Manufacturing Company of Boston, of which Fred Monosson is President, held a lunchhour meeting recently and purchased more than \$5,000 worth of bonds through a payroll deduction plan. A number of non-Jewish employees later asked to be included in the plan.

Purchase of State of Israel Bonds by employees through payroll deduction was also initiated in New York City last week when 35 employees of Debutante Furs met at noon to plan their participation in Israel's economic advancement program. At the request of the employees, Louis Braun and Harry Brown, heads of the firm, agreed to a payroll deduction plan. Five of the employees are not Jewish.

BONDS SOLD ON ISRAEL NAVY SHIPS

For ten days, a destroyer escort and frigate of the Israel Navy were docked at New York harbor and were visited by thousands of New Yorkers. The enormous interest displayed in the ships was exciting to the United States sailors who were berthed at the same pier. The Israel ships were the guests of the United States Navy, which presented the crew of the destroyer with a television set.

During the course of the warships' visit, a number of small group meetings was held on board ship through arrangements made by Benjamin Abrams, Chairman of the Greater New York Israel Bond Committee. Hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of Israel Bonds were sold through such noon and evening meetings, held in the captain's quarters.

Vice-Chairmen of the Bnai Zion Committee are Dr. Robert Gordis, Louis K. Bleecker, Hyman J. Fleigel, Joseph Kleinman, Dr.

Irving Michlin, Dorothy Levine, Harry A. Pine and Jack M. Waldor, who is also serving as Chairman of the Essex County campaign. Secretary of the Bond Committee is Herman Z. Quittman, Executive Director.

TOLEDO REPORTS BOND COMMITMENTS

With only a few weeks of activity behind it, the State of Israel Bond Committee in Toledo, Ohio, headed by Sam Kasle, has received Bond commitments totalling \$338,500, it was reported at the dinner honoring the Prime Minister of Israel in New York on May 9.

CHAIRMEN NAMED IN COMMUNITIES

Jules Aron, prominent businessman of Youngstown, Ohio, President of Century Food Markets, and active in Jewish communal affairs, has accepted the chairmanship of the Bonds for Israel Committee in Youngstown. The initial meeting for sales resulted in subscriptions of \$100,000.

Irving Harris has taken the post of Chairman for Israel Bonds in Scranton, Pa. Sidney Weiss and Mrs. Esther Ginsburgh are Co-Chairmen.

Ben Medofsky is the Chairman in Portland, Oregon.

The committee to organize the Bonds for Israel Committee in New Brunswick, N. J. unanimously designated Hyman Littman as Chairman and Dr. J. S. Joffe as Co-Chairman. Active in all communal and civic endeavors in New Brunswick, Mr. Littman is head of Littman's Jewelers-Opticians, a chain of jewelry stores in New Jersey.

Nathaniel L. Fish, outstanding communal leader, senior partner in N. L. Fish & Co., certified public accountants in New York and New Jersey, has accepted the post of Chairman of the Bonds for Israel Committee in Englewood, N. J.

GOVERNORS BACK ISRAEL BONDS

Governor G. Mennen Williams of Michigan was the first person in the State to purchase an Israel Bond. He bought a \$100 Bond from Max Osnos, Chairman of the Detroit Committee. At the same time, the Governor issued a proclamation, reading as follows:

"Whereas the State of Israel has demonstrated the devotion to freedom and human rights which the United States of America recognizes as essential to the preservation of democracy throughout the world; and

"Whereas the State of Israel is issuing bonds to the amount of \$500,000,000 in the United States for the purpose of strengthening its role as an outpost of freedom and building a strong and self-sufficient national economy; and

"Whereas the Israel Bond Issue will enable the nation to absorb an additional 600,000 immigrants in the next three years, in fulfillment of the humanitarian aims of the country; and

"Whereas the citizens of Michigan, of all creeds, have repeatedly identified themselves with the democratic aims of the State of Israel;

"Now, therefore, I, G. Mennen Williams, Governor of the State of Michigan do hereby proclaim the period beginning May 1, 1951 and ending May 31, 1951 as

ISRAEL BOND MONTH

and urge full support to the State of Israel \$500,000,000 Bond Issue to ensure the successful completion of that nation's National Development Plan."

A similar resolution was issued by Governor Gordon Persons of Alabama, who is Honorary State Chairman for Israel Bonds. Governor Persons was the first person in Alabama to purchase a Bond. His Proclamation marked the week of May 7-14 as "Israel Bond Week" in Alabama.

CLEVELAND STARTS ORGANIZATION

The Jewish community of Cleveland, responding to the outstanding leadership which heads the Israel Bond Committee, last week launched its activities with a small dinner in honor of Eliezer Kaplan, Israel's

Minister of Finance. Preliminary commitments total \$670,000 and come from a comparative handful of people. A great rally was held in Severance Hall with Mrs. Myerson as quest of honor.

The Cleveland Chapter of Hadassah, which is now initiating its Bond activities, started its drive with a gift of a \$50 Israel Savings Bond to the first baby born at Mt. Sinai Hospital on May 1. Mrs. Jacob M. Hurwitz, Hadassah President, made the presentation. The baby was named Hadassah in honor of the occasion.

CENTRAL CONFERENCE BUYS ISRAEL BONDS

The Central Conference of American Rabbis, by vote of its Executive Committee, has decided to purchase \$5,000 of State of Israel Bonds from its trustee funds. This was announced this week by Dr. Philip S. Bernstein, President of the Conference, to Hon. Henry Morgenthau, Jr., Chairman of the Board of Governors of the B.I.G. organization.

UTICA STARTS BOND DRIVE

Maurice S. Levinson was chosen Chairman and over \$100,000 in Israel Bonds was subscribed at the first meeting to launch the Bond campaign in Utica, N. Y. Treasurer of the Oneida Frozen Food Corp., Mr. Levinson has been active in all communal undertakings. Emphasizing that they intended to give him full support, eleven men who attended the organizing meeting bought \$100,000 worth of Bonds and accepted assignments to visit other potential large purchasers. The meeting was called by Martin Abelove, B.I.G. Chairman for Central New York State, and was held in the home of David H. Lurie.

KNOXVILLE PASSES \$100,000

Good organization and devoted leadership are the ingredients for a successful Bonds for Israel Committee. That is the lesson being taught to America by the small communities which have been organizing on highly intensive lines. Knoxville, Tenn. is a stimulating example of this. This tiny community, far from the major centers of Jewish population, was just organized and has already passed the \$100,000 mark in the sale of Israel Bonds, under the vigorous chairmanship of Philip Chazen. The result was obtained even before the Prime Minister of Israel paid a surprise visit to Knoxville, in connection with a trip he made to see the Tennessee Valley Authority, for additional information in connection with Israel's own development programs. The Prime Minister, accompanied by Minister of Labor Golda Myerson, and State Department aides, was given a reception arranged by Guilford Glazer and attended by the Governor of Tennessee, two United States Congressmen and many other State and local officials.

Knoxville has adopted a goal of \$300,000 for itself. Mayor J. W. Elmore proclaimed an Israel Bond Sales Week. The opening meeting was addressed by Sam Rosen, Co-Chairman, Mr. Chazen, Chairman, Maurice Bucove, Melvin Robinson and Max Friedman. Max Morrison, is Steering Committee Chairman. Other Co-Chairmen are Israel Rosen and Max Friedman. Mrs. Nathan Robinson is Treasurer.

A Christian Committee has also been organized. It is headed by George Dempster.

PHILADELPHIA PASSES FIRST MILLION

Late in getting started due to preoccupation with the Allied Jewish Appeal, the Philadelphia Jewish community gave a good account of itself at the first major meeting for Israel Bonds, at which the Prime Minister of Israel was the guest of honor. Over \$1,000,000 in Bonds has been subscribed.

After his triumphant few days in New York, Mr. Ben Gurion left for Philadelphia, visiting with Prof. Albert Einstein at the latter's home on the way. At Philadelphia, Mr. Ben Gurion was given a gala reception at Independence Square, where he paid his respects to the Liberty Bell in the presence of thousands who crowded every inch of space in the world-famous square. Samuel Daroff, who was host to Mr. Ben Gurion at a luncheon reception at his home, was also Chairman at the function at which the Prime Minister spoke in the evening. Among the top Bond purchasers, who emphasized that they were making "initial" commitments, were Samuel Daroff, for Daroff Brothers, \$75,000; William Sylk, for Sylk Brothers, \$75,000; Reuben and Frank Rosen, \$75,000; Max and Charles Kahaner, \$75,000; Robert M. Bernstein, \$25,000; A. M. and Morris Ellis, \$26,000; Samuel Kratzok, Albert M. Bershad and partner, Sam Genel, Louis M. Siever, Monty H. Tyson, \$10,000 each. A number of out-of-towners were present for the dinner. Julius Caplan, of Lebanon, Pa., subscribed to \$25,000 and Morris Batzer, of Atlantic City, \$10,000.

ST. LOUIS OPENS WITH \$900,000

Paced by two group meetings in as many days, St. Louis sold \$900,000 worth of State of Israel Bonds as the community, led by Melvin Dubinsky as Chairman, initiated its activities for the great new economic investment program. The first function was sponsored by the Maccabean Club of St. Louis and had Eliezer Kaplan, Finance Minister of Israel, as guest of honor. Participants in the function also included Mayor Joseph M. Darst, who bought the first Israel Bond in the city, Mr. Dubinsky and Harry Seeve, Director of the American Financial Corporation. The Co-Chairmen of the St. Louis Bond Committee are William S. Cohen, Abe Levin and Nathan Shever.

A few days previously, Dr. Israel Goldstein, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the New York Bond Committee, spoke to the St. Louis Council about the Independence Bond Issue and urged 700 representatives of 130 Jewish organizations to mobilize their forces behind the Israel investment program. Other speakers included M. J. Slonim, President of the St. Louis Council of the American Jewish Congress, and Rabbi Harry Eichenstein.

NEWARK REACHES TOWARD MILLION IN BONDS

The Jewish community of Newark, spurred on by a huge rally addressed by Eddie Cantor, this week was counting up its Israel Bond subscriptions to the \$1,000,000 mark, Jack Slavitt, Chairman, reported.

1,100 CHICAGO WOMEN HEAR MRS. MYERSON

More than 1,100 Chicago women, representing every major Jewish group, literally filled to overflowing the Terrace Casino of the Morrison Hotel at a luncheon meeting last week to hear Israel Labor Minister Golda Myerson deliver a stirring statement on Israel's economic independence. The phenomenal response brought \$280,000 in Israel Bond purchases from the women present.

Reurlet 6-11-51 captioned "Israeli Government Bonds, Inc., Registration Act" enclosing a copy of the Prospectus issued by the American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel, Inc., and certain other literature pertaining to the bonds being offered for sale by this corporation.

You are instructed to prepare an investigative report setting forth the background and organizational status of the subject corporation, including date and place of incorporation, purposes and current activities. The Bureau contemplates presenting to the Department the question of whether this organization should be registered under the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 as amended.

From a review of the material furnished by you, and from a perusal of advertisements of this corporation in recent newspapers and popular periodicals, it appears that the primary purpose of this corporation is to promote the sale of Israeli Government bonds in this country. However, in its promotion activities the corporation might possibly be engaged in distributing propaganda in behalf of the Government of Israel. Such activities, if true, would probably also require its registration under the Foreign Agents Registration Act.

Accordingly, your report should include illustrations of the advertising material issued by the subject corporation. As an example of advertising which might be construed as propaganda, the Bureau has observed a double-page advertisement, sponsored by this corporation, appearing in the magazine section of the New York Times for Sunday, February 11, 1951. It is suggested that you include with your report, for referral to the Department as exhibits, copies of any such advertising material which you might obtain, and also a copy of the Prospectus issued by this corporation

RECURDED - 12 Your report should include out of the partinent information contained in your files, and any fuscher details which you might develop through appropriate sources showing the connection between subject corporation and the Government of Israel, the extent to which the corporation is subsidized directly or indirectly by the Govexement of Israel, and the extent to which the Government of Israel in any way exercises control over the policies or operations of the PROBLEM ZER corporation.

500-MILLION ISRAEL BOND DRIVE PUSHED

Conference Votes Its Support

The first national economic conference for Israel adopted a resolution yesterday calling for total mobilization of the American Jewish community behind the \$500,000,000 Israel independence bond issue being floated here.

Approval of the resolution completed the business of the four-day session which brought together in the Shoreham hotel about 1,100 business and communal leaders representing 33 organizations which are pushing the bond drive.

The conference assured the Jews of the new state that "we shall stand by them in the fulfillment of the economic tasks that are indispensable to their secure future."

Addressed to Morgenthau 🚙

A message from Israel's prime minister, David Ben-Gurion, made public at the closing session, emphasized the "paramount importance" of the bond issue which is aimed to help the country achieve economic independence thru industrial and economic expansion.

The prime minister said "economic growth is the key to our capacity to continue to absorb mass immigration; self-support is the backbone of our existence as a free and creative state." His message was addressed to Henry Morgenthau jr., former secretary of the Treasury and chairman of he board of governors of the Israel wond drive.

Vice President Barkley, guest of honor at a meeting Saturday night when he called for support of Israel as a "devoted democratic ally," announced yesterday the burchase of a \$1,000 Israel bond as a gift for Mrs. Barkley. He told the conference yesterday was his wife's 40th birthday.

"They are more than a mere investment, good as it is," Barkley said. He said they have "social, moral and spiritual values as

well."

Rep. Celler (D) of New York told the conference that the bonds are a sound investment which will bring back the dollars plus interest, and that the issue "will ultimately release Israel from the status of being looked upon as. a philanthropic venture."

Indorsed by Keyserling

4 Leon Keyserling, chairman of the President's council of economic advisers, also indorsed the issue alan investment.

In the view of the plans for the money's use, the achievements of the new state in its short history and the history of its people, Keyserling said, "There are no bonds that can call with greater voice and greater clarity, from the viewpoint of the cold-hearted economist, for our support."

The program of the economic conference was immediately indorsed at a meeting here of the National Administrative council of the Zionist Organization of America.

At the same time Benjamin G. Browdy, Zionist president, pledged his organization's full backing for fulfillment of the plans laid by the World Zionist congress at its meeting in Jerusalem last month. That program embraces aid to immigration into Israel, stimulation of agricultural and economic development, and encouragement of private capital investment among other measures.

The Zionist leaders also discussed plans of their own for a

\$5,000,000 budget to cover activities in America and in Israel.

"We, the undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation pursuant to Article 2 of the Stock Corporation Law of the State of New York, do hereby certify,

"First: The name of the proposed corporation shall be American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel.

"Second: The objects for which this Corporation is formed are to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, sell, exchange, pledge, hypothecate, underwrite, deal in and dispose of, to its own account or as broker, stocks, bonds, votes, debentures, or other evidences of indebtedness and obligations and securities issued or guaranteed by the State of Israel or by any governmental authority or anypolitical or administrative sub-division or department of the State of Israel, and certificates or receipts or any kind representing or evidencing any interest in any such stocks, bonds, votes, debentures, evidences of indebtedness, obligations, or securities, and, while the owner or holder of any such stocks, bonds, votes, debentures; evidences of indebtedness, obligations, securities, certificates, or receipts to exercise all rights of ownership in respect thereof.

"In furtherance of its purposes the corporation will engage in private, non-political, financial, mercantile, and other activities in furtherance of the bona fide trade and commerce of the State of Israel.

"To borrow money and to issue bonds, debentures, or obligations of this corporation from time to time, for any of the objects or purposes of the corporation, and to secure the same by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust, or otherwise.

"To do anything necessary, proper, advisable, or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any of the objects, or in furtherance of any of the powers herein set forth, either above or associated with others, and incidental or pertaining to, or growing out of, or connected with, its business or powers, provided the same be not inconsistent with the laws of the State of New York.

"To exercise all or any of its corporate powers and rights in the State of New York, other states, the District of Columbia, the territories, possessions, or dependencies of the United States, and in foreign countries, but only in the manner and to the extent permitted by the respective laws thereof, and to establish and maintain offices and agencies within, and anywhere outside of, the State of New York.

They are to be issued under the State of Israel (Independence Issue) Law 5771-1951.

on May 2, 1951, SIDNEY GREEN, financial consultant for the company, stated that a detailed balance sheet is not available. However, he did state that the issued bonds and paid in capital as of that date was \$250,000.00. He also stated that under an arrangement with the State of Israel, earnings annually could not exceed \$10,000.00.

In regard to the officers of this corporation, this informant stated that HENRY M. MORGENTHAU, JR. was former y Secretary of the Treasury of the United States, and he is Chairman of the Board of the Modern Industrial Bank and the United Jewish Appeal.

HENRY MONTOR was from 1938 to 1950, executive director of the United Jewish Appeal. RUDOLPH G. SONNEBORN is Secretary and Treasurer of L. Sonneborn and Sons, Inc. JULIAN B. VENEZKY is an attorney in Peoria, Illinois. The Board of Governors consists of 100 members, all of whom are prominent in financial, industrial, commercial and professional circles throughout the United States.

Copies of the Prospectus issue entitled, "State of Israel, \$500,000,000 Independence Issue" dated March 28, 1951 were obtained from the offices of subject corporation. Two copies of this Prospectus are enclosed as exhibits to this report. This Prospectus provides for the sale of interest bearing bonds denominated "15 year, 3½% dollar coupon bonds" to May 1, 1966 and capital appreciation bonds denominated "12 year dollar savings bond", in the aggregate principal amount of \$500,000,000.00.

Under "Summary of Underwriting Agreement" on page 37, it is stated that an agreement will be entered into prior to May 1, 1951 between the State of Israel and the American Financial and Development Corporation relating to the distribution of the bonds. All of the stock of this corporation

is owned by the American Committee for Aid to Israel Immigrants, a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

The corporation may purch ase bonds from the State of Israel at a discount and resell them to the public, or it may act as broker in selling bonds.

The corporation is to receive the following discounts and/or commissions:

"As to bonds purchased by the corporation for resale, the corporation is to receive a discount of 3%; as to bonds which the corporation sells as broker, it is to receive commissions of 3%".

It is provided, however, that the corporation shall not realize a net profit before taxes in excess of \$10,000.00 for any calender year.

The State of Israel will pay all charges, expenses and fees in connection with the preparation, printing, execution, authentication, delivery and issuance of the bonds, their registration under the Securities Act of 1933 and state security statutes, the printing of prospectuses, all taxes and stamps required in connection with the sale of the bonds, and all sums payable to the Fiscal Agent, the District Banks and the Community Banks."

It also provides that a Fiscal Agreement will be entered into prior to Nay 1, 1951 between the State of Israel and the Chase Mational Bank of New York City, making this bank, Fiscal Agent for these bonds. The Fiscal Agent will be the "agent of the State of Israel".

The purpose of the bonds is stated to be part of a three year program of the Government of Israel for the economic development of the State.

The Prospectus gives a History of the formation of the State of Israel, its war with the Arabs, and a description of its Geography, climate, mineral resources and Fovernment. It also gives an account of its present financial

condition and its plans for the future.

Photostatic copy of "Israel Speaks" for September 14, 1951, page 1. contains an article which states that \$\infty 50,000,000\$ has already been received as a result of Israel bond sales in the United States.

Page 11 of the same issue of "Israel Speaks", contains an article entitled, "One Year of Progress on the Economic Front" which states that "The National Economic Conference" would be held in Washington, D. C. at the Shoreham Hotel from September 20-23, 1951, under the auspices of the "American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel which directs the sale of the Israel \$\infty\$500,000,000 bond issue in the United States.

A full page ad in the "New York Times" for September 18, 1951 by subject corporation gives "two frank answers to your questions about State of Israel Bonds".



PURPOSE:

To recommend that records of the Security Exchange Commission be reviewed by the Liaison Unit for information regarding captioned organization.

DETAILS:

The American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel (AFDCI) is presently engaged in the sale of Israeli Government bonds in this country. The Washington Post Newspaper for May 1, 1951, on page 20 carried a full page advertisement announcing the first bond issue by the State of Israel in the amount of \$500,000,000 and indicated that the bonds would be sold by the above organization with offices at 120 Broadway, New York, 5, New York.

Investigation has failed to reveal the registration of this organization with either the State Department or the Department of Justice. Investigation has revealed that Hirshon-Garfield Incorporated, 745 Fifth Avenue, New York City, registered with the Department of Justice as an agent of a foreign principal. The registration abstract of this company reflects that its business is advertising and that it is acting as an agent of the "Government of Israel-American Financial and Development Corporation for the State of Israel" for the purpose of placing advertisements in magazines and newspapers.

Investigation of the Newspaper, "Israel Speaks," reflects that at one time "Israel Speaks" was being considered as a medium for advertising the sale of this bond issue. Later information reflects, however, that it will not be used for this purpose, but will be directly subsidized by the Israeli Government. The question of the registration of "Israel Speaks" was presented to the Department. On May 29, 1951, the Department stated that the evidence at that time failed to reflect that "Israel Speaks" had actually received funds from the Israeli Government or from officials of the AFDCI, although there was detailed information as to negotiations for obtaining such support for "Israel Speaks." The Department requested that in the course of a continued investigation of "Israel Speaks," efforts be made to determine whether money has passed to "Israel Speaks" from either the Government of Israel or from the AFDCI. The Department

further requested that the Bureau attempt to determine whether the AFDCI is subsidized directly or indirectly by the Government of Israel.

RECOMMENDATION:

In accordance with SEC suggestion, attached letter has been prepared requesting that Agency's cooperation in making its records available to a representative of this Bureau. This letter should be delivered by the Liaison Unit.

It is requested that a representative of the Liaison Unit review the SEC file on captioned organization specifically for the following data:

- l. Background information of the corporation including date and place of incorporation, purpose, and identity of principal officers.
- 2. Capitalization including the method of financing and the source of such funds.
- 3. Any pertinent information indicating that captioned corporation is in anyway connected with or financed by or an agent of the Israeli Government or any official agency of that Government.

According to the files of the Newark Office, JOEL GROSS, who was born on 8/16/07 at Jersey City, N.J., has been self-employed as an Attorney at Law at 744 Broad St., Newark, N.J., for approximately 13 years.

Newark Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, stated on 4/24/46 that JOEL GROSS owed \$2 for a club subscription to the "Daily Worker", an east coast Communist newspaper.

Newark Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, stated that membership in the Daily Worker Press Club was tantamount to membership in the Communist Party.

On 1/16/48, an article which appeared in the "Newark Evening News", a daily newspaper published in Newark, N.J., reflected that the N.J. Independent Citizens League delegates and alternates were leaving Newark, N.J., that day for the National Convention of the Progressive Citizens of America, which was held at the Hotel Knickerbocker, Chicago, Ill., 1/17-18/48.

CONSIDENTIAL

According to this article, the State Officers of the N.J. Independent Citizens League at that time were JAMES HMBRIE, President; JOEL GROSS, Mrs. CATHERINE VAN ORDEN, MORTON STAVIS, Vice Chairmen; DOROTHI LEVINE, Secretary; and BERNARD ROTH, Treasurer.

T-2 stated that the Independent Citizens League of N.J. became known as the Progressive Party during June, 1948, and that CATHERINE VAN ORDEN, a Vice Chairman of this organization, was known to him to be a member of the Communist Party.

T-2 further related that MARTHA STONE, State Chairman of the Communist Party of N.J., has assigned many Communist Party members in N.J. to work within the Progressive Party and that almost all Progressive Party candidates for public office in N.J. are known to him as CP members, and that pleas to support the Progressive Party candidates and to attend Progressive Party meetings have been made at CP meetings

An article entitled, "Russia Praised By Ambijan Speakers", which appeared in the 2/9/49 edition of the "Newark Evening News", reflected that JOEL GROSS and one Dr. J. RAYMOND WALSH appeared as speakers at the annual dinner of the Ambijan Committee which was held at the Robert Treat Hotel in Newark, N.J. on 2/8/51. Dr. WALSH reportedly lauded Soviet Russia for its tremendous contribution toward coordinating the peoples of dissimilar nationalities and minorities, and for the very definite contribution to civilization made by Russia.

Both WALSH and GROSS, according to this article, scored British policy relative to Palastine and urged speedy action by the United Nations to implement the decision granting Jewish statehood. Gross stated that, "Agencies of Facsism and Naziism are active again and are even more turbulent then they were before the war, only now they act more subtly and seek to hide before so called moral principles."

Newark Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that the American Bureau of Birobidjan Committee was formed in 1934 for the purpose of financially supporting the settlement of Jews in Birobidjan, a territory in Siberia, set aside for such purpose by the Soviet Government. According to this informant, many of the officers and members of this committee are known members of the Communist Party.

Newark Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, stated on 10/10/49 that JOEL GROSS continued to hold the position of a Vice-Chairman in the Progressive Party of N.J.

Newark Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, also stated on 8/3/50 that GROSS was still a Vice-Chairman of the Progressive Party in N.J.

The indices of the Newark Office contained no information relative to DOROTHY CHERNIN, SIDNEY S. GREEN, HENRY MONTOR, RUDOLPH-SONNEBORN.

Attached hereto for your information and the completion of your files is the report of Special Agent Villiam G. U'Donnell, dated February 21, 1352, et New York City.

As you will recall from a review of the reports furnished you in this investigation, the American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel was incorporated under the laws of New Fork December 21, 1950, for the purpose of selling \$500,000,000.00 worth of bonds for the State of Israel. The corporation was to buy and resell bonds at a three and one half per cent discount, or to act as brokers for the sale of bonds for a three and one half per cent commission. Although this would appear to be a regular business transaction your attention is invited to the attached copy of the Prospectus, published by subject corporation under date of March 28, 1951, which reflects that an agreement would be entered into before May 1, 1951, between the State of Israel and subject corporation for the sale of Israel Covernment bonds.

One stipulation of this underwriting agreement limits the earnings of subject corporation from the sale of such bonds to (10,000.00 annually. This Prospectus also related that all of the stock of subject corporation is owned by the American Committee for Aid to Israeli Immigrants, ---a-non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey. The report of Special Agent Clark D. Tomptine, dated January 10, 1959, at Mowark, New Jersey, contains the complete background of this organization reflecting that it is a non-stock corporation not organized for gains or individual profit and that noddividende shall ever be declared or paid to any of its members allysincome of this corporation beyond that necessary to carry out its progress and any surplus remaining upon dissolution is to be transferred to such organizations which are devoted to the relief and rehabilitation of refugees in the State of Israel as may be designated by the loard of Trustees. In offect, then, it would appear that the profits of subject corporation would revert to the holder company which is a non-profit organization and could not therefore declare dividends for its stockholders. It is noted that Henry Montor and Rudolf G. Lonnebora are officials of both corporations.



By memorandum dated March 10, 1952, the Bureau referred the question as to whether subject corporation should be registered under the Foreigh Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. At that time, it was pointed out that subject corporation was incorporated under the laws of New York, December 21, 1950, for the purpose of selling 500 million dollars worth of bonds for the State of Israel. It was further pointed out that in the prospectus published by subject corporation under date of March 28, 1951, it was indicated that an agreement would be entered into prior to May 1. 1951, between the State of Israel and subject corporation for the sale of Israeli Government bonds. One stipulation of this underwriting agreement limits the earnings of subject corporation from the sele of bonds to \$10,000 annually. This prospectus also related that all of the stock of subject corporation is owned by the American Committee for Aid to Israeli Immigrants, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the state of New Jersey. Investigation of this organization revealed that it is a corporation not organized for gains or individual profit and that no dividends shall ever be declared or paid to any of its members. All income of this corporation beyond that necessary to carry out its progress and any surplus remaining upon dissolution is to be transferred to such organizations which are devoted to the relief and rehabilitation of refugees in the State of Israel as may be designated by the Board of Trustees.

The Department was requested to advise whether or not the above financial arrangement was a device designed to circumvent the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1935, as amended, and to further advise whether or not subject firm should be registered. The Department was also requested to advise what, if any, additional investigation was desired.

Attached hereto for your information is a copy of a memorandum from Assistant Attorney General James M. McInerney of the Criminal Division, dated May 5, 1952, in response to the Bureau's inquiry.

Reference is made to your memorandum of March 10, 1952. in which you requested advice as to whether the financial arrangement described in your memorandum is a device designed? to circumvent the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, as well as whether the subject firm should be registered under the provisions of the Statute. You also requested advice as to what, if any, additional investigation was desired in this matter.

The Department was consulted by the organizers of the subject corporation concerning its status under the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. The organizers advised that the subject firm would exist for the sole purpose of dealing in securities and other obligations issued and guaranteed by the State of Israel; that while it would operate as a corporation with a nominal complement of paid personnel, it would, in addition, have thousands of volunteer workers throughout the country; and that its ultimate purpose was nonprofit in promoting investment in Israel so as to integrate refugees into the economy of that country.

In the circumstances, it was the Department's opinion that the organization came within the definition of the term "agent of a foreign principal" contained in Section l(c)(2)of the Act, but that the Corporation could avail itself of the exemption contained in Section 3(d) of the Statute, as engaging in financial activities in furtherance of the bona fide trade and commerce of the State of Israel and in activities to relieve human suffering.

In the circumstances, the registration of the subject organization on the facts presented was not required. pointed out, however, that the exemption was available only so long as the Corporation did not engage in any political activity as defined by Rule 100 of the Act on behalf of the State of Israel.

On 10/18/52, Mrs. STELLA E. BARUCH, 4 Peter Gooper Road, New York City, and Mr. MANUEL POSY, 824 East 9th Street, Brooklyn, New York, provided the following information at the New York Office:

Both advised they are employed by the captioned corporation, BARUCH as Personnel Director, and POSY as Field Supervisor. This corporation was organized to sell bonds for Israel. BARUCH and FOSY advised they have noticed an infiltration into this organization by Communists who are acting to hinder the sale of bonds to defeat the success of Israel. They said this infiltration has reached the point where a number of persons who have voiced the Communist line are in key positions. They advised that their Brooklyn Office appears to be most infiltrated.

They furnished the following names and information concerning persons they suspected of being Communists, although they had no direct information or admissions that such is true:

FILTX ALBERT, 120 Broadway, New York City, who is Assistant City Lanager of the Campaign for Greater New York and controls about 200 supervisors and all assignments.

ALICE JANSON, 120 Broadway, New York City, who is Assistant to ALBERT and is known for her association with causes on the Attorney General's list.

WILLIAM SCHWARTZ, who formerly held ALBERT'S job and is now with the American Technion Society (a group training engineers for Israel).

TRUDY LIVELED, who is a Clerk in the Brooklyn Office.

LEONARD BRAPKIN, who is a Brooklyn Office Field Man, a known Communist, and the brother of STANLEY DRAPKIN, who is not a Communist and is under fire by FELIX ALBERT. STANLEY DRAPKIN is Chairman of the CIO Local Union at this company, the union which took over after Local 19, UOPMA, was kicked out.

MAT FRANKLISH, Brooklyn, who is Area director for the cale of bonds in lower New York State and associates with ZOLARO, Bontecello, New York, who heads the Communist Party in that area. PINISTICH has defended the Communist Party line to FOSY and has voiced the necessity to withdraw treeps from Horea.

SPAN MULLY, who is in the Albany Office.

HARB MARSHAUER, Aktron, Chio, who was former union organizer for Local 65.

ME. WILICION, who is from Pittsburgh, Rennsylvania.

ELAIN VASHTAU, nee WIFKICH, who is receptionist.

RUTE VIF WOR, sister of PLAIN ALL and a polic victim, who has employed Communist methods in mion meetings.

They advised, at the time of complaint, that they could give no further descriptive data other than that given above but a complete personal history of the above could be obtained by contacting BARNON at a later date.

They advised that their reason for coming to the FRT was to obtain corroborative haromatica concerning these people.

Supervisor WARKE 7. MARKES AND contacted BARUCH on 10/30/52 and 11/14/52, and SA LOWES J. CERULAR contacted her on 12/15/52, but PARKER advised each time that she was too busy to provide the data required to identify the persons named in the complaint.

A review of the New York indices provided the following information which may be identical with some of the persons hased in the complaint:

A FELIX ALTER was named by informants as a fund raiser in 1944, for Musian War Welief; in February, 1946, he was at a conference with ALCEA W. A MAT NYASHMICE refused to talk to Mew Mork Agents regarding individuals under indictment under Janith Act in Monolulu; was seen wearing United States Army uniform in 1948 May Tary Parade, Mew Mork City; believed a delegate to Convention of Progressive Citizens of America in Chicago, in January, 1948; Digned letter of protect to Monolulu School Loard regarding suspension of teachers for Jonumnist Party activity.

A STALLER ABRANT, 1185 Malton Lvenue, Bronn, New York, in March, 1944, was reported as being Chairman of Lower Mest Gronn Committee Granumist Party.

A NICH LATEAL, 125 mast 4th Street, New York City, was, as of June, 1941, member of 6th Assembly district Communist Club and Communist Political Association, when name was changed. NICH LIPMACK was a functionary of the United Pederal Workers of America, CIO; made appointment to see BILL LAMPHOE, New York State CPA Secretary, in March, 1945; in 1944, was secretary of Mast Side Temants' Acagus; was on mailing list of the Conference of Inalienable Rights, which merged with the New York Referation for Constitutional Liberties in 1942; her entire family is reported as having a Communist background, and she was reported typing material for the Communist Party, pelieved for EASL ENGINER.

TRUNT LIMBT ID was a delegate from the "New Life Club - "anhattan" to the Second Mational Convention, Young Progressives of America, held in Cleveland, Chio, in Movember, 1949.

Since the New York of vision is not in possession of sufficient personal information concerning subjects named in the complaint to determine identity, and since free dation, who has this information, has indicated a non-cooperative activate, at the present vine, no further action is being taken by this office, unless advised to the centrary by the fureau.

INFORMATION CONCERNING

Pursuant to Mr. Tolson's request, the Bureau's files were reviewed for information on one Felix Albert, who was connected with the American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel. It is noted that this Corporation was set up for the purpose of selling bonds for Israel.

By letter dated January 5, 1953, the New York Office reported that Mrs. Stella E. Baruch, 4 Peter Cooper Road, New York City, and Mr. Manuel Posy, 824 East 9th Street, Brooklyn, New York, Personnel Director and Field Supervisor, respectively, of the American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel, reported to the New York Office that they had noticed an infiltration into this organization by Communists, who are acting to hinder the sale of bonds for Israel. Baruch and Posy alleged that this infiltration had reached the point where a number of persons who have voiced the Communist line are in key positions. They asserted that their Brooklyn office appeared to be most infiltrated.

Baruch and Posy furnished the names of 11 employees of this Corporation whom they suspected of being Communists although they had no specific basis for their assertion. Included among those suspected is Felix Albert, who is described by Baruch and Posy as Assistant City Manager of the Campaign for Greater New York in the American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel. Albert, according to these individuals, controls about 200 supervisors and all assignments.

Baruch and Posy could furnish no further descriptive data on the persons about whom they complained but stated that a complete personal history of these individuals could be obtained by getting in touch with Baruch at a later date. Mrs. Baruch was contacted on three different occasions following the initial interview but each time advised she was too busy to provide the necessary data to identify the persons about whom she and Posy complained.

In its letter New York advised that its files contain the following information which may be identical with the Felix Albert in question. One Felix Albert was named by informants as a

fund raiser in 1944 for Russian War Relief. In February, 1946, a Felix Albert attended a conference with Richard Morford, Executive Director of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship. A Felix Albert was New York Public Relations Representative in the Highlander Folk School, Monteagle, Tennessee. As of September, 1949, one Felix Albert was on the General Office Membership List of IVO Lodge #54. (97-3038-22)

The Bureau files confirm the information reported by New York concerning the conference had between Albert and Morford. This occurred on February 20, 1946. It is noted that Albert reportedly was connected with the Russian War Relief and the conference concerned a collection by Russian War Relief of technical books to be sent to the Soviet Union. During the conference Albert mentioned that Russian War Relief was not interested in any books other than technical ones for the Soviet Union. (40-46866-48 p.38)

Bureau files also confirm the report of the New York
Office concerning the appearance of the name Felix Albert on the
General Office Membership List of IWO Lodge #54. This list shows
that this Felix Albert was born in 1913. The IWO has been cited
by the Attorney General.

A fingerprint card of Private Felix Albert, Army Serial No. 42052683, a repatriated U. S. prisoner of war, was forwarded to the Bureau from the Legal Attache, London, England, under date of May 5, 1945. Albert, at that time, was in the 7th General Hospital, European Theater of Operations. These fingerprint cards were made available to the Legat by the CIC Detachment in Europe. (65-36220-794X12)

Of course, it is not known whether the above references relate to the Felix Albert in question in view of the lack of identifying personal data.

Additionally, the Bureau files contain 12 references to F. Albert. These have been reviewed and it is noted that most of them refer to individuals outside the U. S., particularly in South America and Mexico.

Based on the above information, normally a security investigation would not be undertaken by the Bureau.

/ Congressman Emanuel Celler called me yesterday stating that he had received a call from Mr. Henry Montor, head of Tele. R the American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel, 120 Broadway, New York, stating that it was suspected that one Felix Albert, an employee of this corporation, may be under suspicion of engaging in un-American activities. I indicated to Congressman Celler that Albert's activities might be hindering the sale of bonds for Israel. Congressman Celler wondered whether we had any information concerning Albert.

On the basis of the attached memorandum prepared by Inspector Laughlin, I telephoned Congressman Celler today advising him that our New York Office received a letter on January 5 from Mrs. Stella E. Baruch and Mr. Manuel Posy, of the American Financial and Development Corporation of Israel, reporting that they had noticed the possible infiltration of Communists into the organization and indicating that they had listed Albert as one of the employees whom they suspected. I told Congressman Celler that we had contacted Mrs. Baruch on three different occasions following the initial interview but each time she indicated that she was too busy to provide specific information concerning the persons about whom she and Posy had complained.

I told Congressman Celler that we would be very glad to send an Agent to see Mr. Montor and explain the developments in this matter to him and to see whether he could furnish any specifics concerning Albert which would justify any action being taken on the part of the Bureau. I told Inspector Laughlin to see that this was done. Following this interview with Mr. Montor. we can decide whether there is sufficient information to justify opening a case on Albert.

In accordance with telephonic instructions received from the Bureau on January 29, 1953, SA Edward J. Cibulay, on 2/2/53, interviewed Mr. Henry Montor, American Financial and Development Corporation For Israel, 120 Broadway, New York, New York.

Mr. Montor advised that he had no personal knowledge of anyone in this organization being in any way subversive to this country, but he had been informed by Mrs. STELLA E. BARUCH, Fersonnel Directress of the captioned organization, that she had reason to believe the following were Communists: LOUIS JAMES SELIGSON; STANLEY COMMURRAY; ELAINE LIKASHTAN (nee LIPNACK); RUTH LIPNACK; GERTRUDE LINFIELD; NATHAN PITASHNICK; LEONARD DRAPKIN; HERBERT-WARSHAUER; MRS. ALICE JAYSON; and FELIX ALBERT. Mr. Montor said that he was gravely concerned with the possibility of FELIX ALBERT's being A Communist or being affiliated with any Communist group because of lir. Albert's high position in this organization. Mr. Montor said he had no personal reason for questioning Mr. ALBERT's loyalty other than for the information furnished by Mrs. Baruch. Mr. Montor said that Mr. ALBERT has efficiently performed his duties as New York City Director and has never given reason to believe he is attempting to undermine the purpose of this organization, which is to sell bonds for Israel. Concerning the others mentioned, Mr. Montor advised that he has no knowledge of them except that provided by Mrs. BARUCH.

Mrs. STELLA BARUCH advised that she had received her information regarding the above-named ten from MILTON ARONS, Union Organizer and CARL RACHLIN, Union Attorney, Community and Social Agency Employees, Local 1707, C.I.O. Mrs. BARUCH said ARONS and RACHLIN described these employees to her as being Communist or Communist affiliated. Mrs. BARUCH said these union officials are strongly anti-Communist.

In addition to receiving information concerning ALBERT and JAYSON from the union, she said she also received information from a "Socialist" employee who said he knew ALBERT years ago as having associated with Communists, and that she received information from a reliable source that ALICE JAYSON had said that Communism "was her cause". Mrs. BARUCH did not wish to reveal the source of this information because it was given in high confidence, but she will furnish it if absolutely necessary and cannot be determined in any other way.

JAYSON gave ALBERT as a reference when she applied for her position with the organization. Concerning LEONARD DRAPKIN, who left the organization, 12/26/52, BARUCH said that LEONARD DRAPKIN's brother, STANLEY DRAPKIN, who is currently with the organization, advised her that LEONARD was a Communist.

Mrs. BARUCH advised that WILLIAM SCHWARTZ, mentioned in her original complaint, was mentioned only as having preceded FELIX ALBERT in his position and that she has no reason to question his loyalty. Concerning MILTON ARONS and CARL RACHLIN, union officials, who advised BARUCH of the ten named, the indices of the New York Office contains no record of MILTON ARONS, but show that one CARL RACHLIN, According to Confidential Informant was a member of the Socialist Workers Party, Brooklyn Branch, as late as 2/29/52.

Reurlets January 5, 1959, and February 3, 1953, which concern allegations originating with Mrs. Stella Baruch, Personnel Director of the above corporation, to the effect that certain individuals connected with this corporation are suspected of being Communists.

The Bureau desires that Urs. Baruch be immediately interviewed by you to establish the basis for the allegations against the individuals who have been previously named by her. Desults of this interview should be immediately furnished to the Bureau.

It is noted that the letter dated February 3, 1953, indicates that Ars. Baruch may have received her information from other individuals. The Bureau desires that the allegations concerning the employees of this corporation be traced to their source, and if it is determined that Ars. Baruch received her information through other sources, these individuals should be interviewed unless some reason exists they this action should not be taken. Any information received from other individuals should be immediately made available to the Bureau along with the results of the interview with Ars. Faruch. If it is determined that other individuals are involved in these allegations and they are not contacted, the Lureau should be advised of the infinity of these individuals together with the reasons this they were not contacted.

Mrs. STELLA BARUCH, Personnel Director, captioned organization, was reinterviewed on 3/9/53 and advised that Union Officials MILTON ARONS and CARL RACHLIN of the COMMUNITY AND SOCIAL AGENCY EMPLOYEES, Local 1707, CIO, advised her that they were suspect of the following, who were employees of the captioned organization, being Communists or sympathetic to Communism; she does not know the source or reasons for the union officials belief that this is so:

BARUCH advised she had heard MENDELSON was previously interviewed by the FBI in regard to another matter, and she requested that this interview be conducted on a pretext so as not to make MENDELSON aware she advised the FBI of her knowledge of ALBERT.

BARUCH also said that one of ALBERT'S direct assistants had also advised her that he was suspect of ALBERT'S loyalty.

Reference is made to New York letters dated Narch 4, 1953; March 10, 1953; March 23, 1953, and March 26, 1953, reflecting the results of interviews with Mrs. Stella Baruch.

It appears from the interview conducted with Mrs. Baruch on March 9, 1953, that the sources of Mrs. Baruch's information concerning possible Communist infiltration on the part of certain employees of this company were Milton Arons and Carl Rachlin of the Community and Social Agency Employees, Local 1707, CIO. As you were instructed in Bureau letter dated February 10, 1953, the Bureau desires that these allegations be traced to their source and these individuals should be interviewed unless you are in possession of information which would make such interviews inadvisable in which event you should advise the Bureau.

The information should be examined carefully and investigations initiated where warranted under existing Bureau standards for security cases. The Bureau also desires to be advised as to the action you are taking concerning each of the individuals against whom these allegations have been made and whether investigation is being initiated.

NOTE ON YELLOW ONLY:

The allegations made by Mrs. Baruch were that certain employees of instant company were suspected of being Communists. Congressman Celler inquired of Mr. Tolson concerning Felix Albert, one of the individuals against whom allegations have been made. Congressman Celler was advised that specific information would be obtained about persons where mentioned in allegations and a decision would be made as to whether an investigation should be made. Pertaining to ALICE JAYSON, BARUCH advised that, in addition to the union officials, a personal friend of JAYSON'S advised her that JAYSON was a communist. BARUCH said she contacted her source and told her that she wished to make this information available to the FBI. BARUCH said the woman became hysterical at this suggestion and told her she would not talk to any FBI agents. She told BARUCH not to give her name to the FBI. Mrs. BARUCH advised that JAYSON recently left this organization and is currently working for the American Technion, 80 Fifth Avenue, NY, NY, an organization which aids developing technical personnel for interview. BARUCH advised that, in addition to the union officials, STANLEY DRAPKIN, an employee of this organization, described his brother, LEONARD DRAPKIN, as a Communist. BARUCH advised LEONARD DRAPKIN is no longer with the captioned organization.

BARUCH advised that GERTRUDE LINFIELD left this employment on 10/31/52, and NATHAN RITASHNICK left on 12/19/52.

BARUCH said nothing had ever come to her attention which would indicate the above-named people in her organization were attempting to hinder this organization in its sale of bonds for Israel. She advised errors were made by some that could be accounted for as human failings.

Investigation is continuing.

Mrs. STELLA BARUCH, Personnel Director of the above-captioned organization, was contacted on 3/25/53. BARUCH advised that even though MANUEL POSY was with her when she originally made a complaint concerning this matter at the New York Office, she advised on 3/25/53 that she has since come to know POSY better and now considers him too talkative and requested that the interviewing agent respect her judgment and not interview POSY.

Throughout the numerous interviews with Mrs. BARUCH, BARUCH has been respectful of the Bureau, but it was apparent by her refusal to provide the names of her informants and by her statements of fear for causing embarrassment to her organization, that Mrs. BARUCH is more concerned with the possibility of scandal and problems in her organization than with providing information to aid the FBI in its work.

Although it was explained to Mrs. BARUCH that the files of the FBI are confidential and that the New York Division will not report the results of the investigation to her, Mrs. BARUCH stated that she was anxious to have the doubt concerning FELIX ALBERT resolved. At the time of Mrs. BARUCH's original complaint, she stated that her reason for coming to the New York Office was to obtain corroborative information concerning the individuals named.

The indices of the New York Division contained the following information concerning the persons named by Mrs. BARUCH:

Concerning FELIX ALBERT:

FELIX ALBERT was named by informants as a fund raiser in 1944 for Russian War Relief; in February 1946, he was at a conference with RICHARD MORFORD, Executive Director of the National Council of American Sovjet Friendship; was New York Public Relations Representative of the Highlander Falls School located at Monteagle, Tennessee; as of September 1949, was on the General Office Membership List of IWO Lodge 51.

It was noted that FELIX ALBERT, in his application with the captioned organization, advised that he was employed by Russian War Relief from January 1946 to August 1946 as Director of Special Gifts and from February 1942 to January 1943 as a fund raiser.

Concerning ALICE JAYSON:

ALICE JAYSON is the subject of a Security Index card in the New York Division.

It was noted that JAYSON, in her application for employment with the captioned organization, advised that she was General Editor and an "Assistant having an interest" in the newspaper of JOHANNES STEEL, whom LOUIS BUDENZ described as a member of the Communist Party.


Mrs. BARUCH advised that ALICE JAYSON is no longer an employee of the captioned organization.

Concerning GERTRUDE ESTELLE ALINFIELD, nee CHAP, wa: Trudy Linfield:

Mrs. STELLA BARUCH advised that LINFIELD terminated her employment with this organizaton on 10/31/52.

The New York Division is currently conducting a Security Matter investigation on LINFIELD, who subscribes to the "Daily Worker" and who was described in 1947 as being a member of the CP with her father, LITMAN CHAP, and her husband, JORDAN SINFIELD. Information concerning GERTRUDE LINFIELD and her father, LITMAN CHAP, being members of the CP should not be disclosed to outside agencies at this time.

LINFIELD advised in her application with the captioned organization that she was employed by the Book Find Club, 401 Broadway, New York, New York, May 1950 to June 1951. The Book Find Club was described by the 3/17/43 issue of the "Daily Worker" as "...a new recruit to the fight....for propagation of a free Marxist exploration idea in America."

Concerning, HERBERT NARSHAUER, wa: Herbert Warshaver:

As of June 1944, WARSHAUER was a member of the CP, Brooklyn, New York; in April 1943 he contacted a member of the Industrial Section of the CP concerning the forthcoming May Day Parade WARSHAUER and his wife, HEIEN, registered with the American Labor Party in 1941 and 1943 and both signed the CP nominating petitions in 1940 and 1941.

Concerning STANLEY C.AMURRAY:

STANLEY MURRAY, 1185 Walton Avenue, Bronx, New York, as of October 1944, was a member of the Bronx County CP.

It was noted that STANLEY MURRAY advised in his application for employment with the captioned organization that he was on the staff of the **Jewish** Council for Russian War Relief from June 1943 to December 1945.

Concerning LEONARD DRAPKIN:

Mrs. BARUCH advised that LEONARD DRAPKIN terminated employment with this organization on 12/26/52.

The New York Division is currently conducting a Security Matter investigation on DRAPKIN.


Concerning NAT PITASHNICK:

Mrs. BARUCH advised that PITASHNICK left this organization on 12/19/52.

Concerning ELAINE LIPNACK:

ELAINE/LIPNACK, as of January 1945, was a member of the Henry Forbes Community Club, Communist Political Association, New York City, and signed the CP nominating petition 9/30/40. LIPNACK and her family were described by an informant as Communists and receivers of the "Daily Worker".

Concerning RUTH LIPNACK, wa: Ruth Nathan:

RUTH LIPNACK, sister of ELAINE, as of June 1944, was a member of the Communist Club of the 8th Assembly District, 201 Second Avenue, New York, New York; for about a year, typed material for the CP and was Secretary of the East Side Tenants' League.

It was noted that RUTH LIPNACK in her application at the captioned organization advised that in 1948-1949 she was employed by the Progressive Party as a fund raiser.

Concerning LOUIS JAMES SELIGSON:

The New York Division indices reflected nothing identifiable with SELIGSON.

No further investigation will be conducted by the New York Division, UACB, because of the following: informants had no knowledge of a Communist infiltration into this organization; Mr. HENRY MONTOR, Executive Vice President, and Mrs. STELIA BARUCH, Personnel Director, both said they had no reason to believe the persons named attempted to hinder the aims of the captioned organization; no further information can be obtained from the captioned organization.

Copies of this letter are being furnished the Albany, Cleveland and Pittsburgh Divisions for information concerning MURRAY, WARSHAUER and SELIGSON, respectively.

Mrs. STELLA FARUCH, Personnel Director of captioned organization, advised on 3/9/53, that MINDEL MENDELSON, currently a representative of the captioned organization at Room 2215, David Stott Building, Detroit, Michigan, advised of his being suspicious of FELIX at BERT's loyalty to this country.

A lead to interview MENDELSON is not being sent to Detroit because further investigation has shown that he is identical with a MENDEL MENDELSON, investigated by the Mar Department, armed Service Forces, Office of the Provest Marshal General in a resort dated 5/20/44.

This investigation showed that MENDELSON who at that time was employed as installation machinist at the Federal Ship Yard Dry Dock Company, Port Newark, New Jersey, was arrested in 1938 for annoying a girl in the subway resulting in his being given a mental examination in Bellevue Hospital and consequently being sent to Pilgrims State Hospital for 12 months. on 9/11/40 he was committed to Bellevue Hospital, MY, MY, for an attempted sucide and although doctors recommended he be committed to Islip State Hospital for mental diseases he was released to the custody of his father. He once attacked his mother and attempted to choke her. EXPEDITE PROCESSING

On 11/12/41 MENDELSON was again committed to Bellevue Hospital on complaint of his mother, who stated that he attempted suicide several times and had been in trouble for impersonating other people.

At an interview with hospital authorities, he advised them he had been a Communist while in high school. Psychiatrist

diagnosed as having "dangerous tendencies, depressed, suicidal, homicidal, no insight, potentially dangerous to himself and others", and was transferred to the Pilgrims State Hospital on 11/26/41 and was released on 1/14/42.

This investigation showed that MENDELCON's neighbors advised that he had lectured to children on Communism, had often attempted suicide by gas and once attempted to jump out of a window.

A copy of this letter is being sent to the Detroit Division for their information in the event contact with MEMDELSON might occur in the future. Mrs. BERUCH who has advised that MANUEL POSY has been busy attending fund drives and meetings for this organization and has not been at his office, will not be available for interview until 3/25/53.

Mrs. BARUCH will again be contacted on 3/25/53 to arrange interview with MANUEL POSY.

Mrs. STELLA BARUCH. Personnel Director of the captioned organization, reported that she had been advised by MILTONY ARONS and CARL. RACHLIN that certain employees of the AFDCI were somewhat sympathetic to Communism.

ARONS and RACHLIN were interviewed by SA's EDWARD J. CIBULAY and ALESIO SAVIOLA on 4/29/53. They are associated with Local 1707 of the Community and Social Agency Employees Union of the CIO. ARONS holds the position of Organizer; RACHLIN is the Attorney for Local 1707.

ARONS and RACHLIN were immediately advised that the FBI had no interest in matters which pertained to the field of union activities or to the relations between labor and management. However, it was pointed out to them that the FBT is interested in Communist activity wherever it may occur.

ARONS and RACHLIN said that ordinarily inquiries of this nature were referred to the union's national office for clearance. While they felt that formalities should be dispensed with, they nevertheless requested that the interview and information they furnished be handled on a confidential basis so that no misinterpretations could be formed by the national office of their union.

The files of the New York Office contain no information concerning MILTON ARONS. According to Confidential Informant RACHLIN was a member of the Socialist Workers Party, Brooklyn Branch, as late as 2/29/52.

ARONS and RACHLIN advised that they and their union are strongly anti-Communist and they have been constantly vigilant to keep their union free from Communist infiltration. EXPEDITE FIRE

They advised that not so long ago the subject organization employed several persons whom they believed to be at least followers of the Communist Party line.

They advised Mrs. BARUCH of this situation. In spite of this, these people were continued in their employment by the AFDCI. They finally told Mrs. BARUCH that if the AFDCI retained these people in their positions, they would publicize the fact that the AFDCI employed people of strong Communist sympathies and that the Union would disclaim all responsibility for the employment policy of this organization.

As a result of this warning, the AFDCI eased these questionable people out of the organization. It is their opinion that, at this time, there is no Communist influence within the AFDCI.

ARONS and RACHLIN suspected that FELIX ALBERT was sympathetic to Communism because they believed that FELIX ALBERT arranged for the employment of people by the AFDCI after they were recommended to him by HYMAN DENERSTEIN, who is an SI subject in the New York Division. They had no other reason to believe ALBERT had Communist sympathies.

ARONS and RACHLIN believed the following were at least sympathetic to Communism:

GERTRUDE LINFIELD // ELAINE LIPNACK // RUTH-LIPNACK

They advised that they came to this conclusion because these individuals, at union meetings, generally took the Communist Party stand on questions posed before the meeting. These individuals followed the CP line even on resolutions and questions which were brought before the meetings for the sole purpose of bringing the Communist sympathizers out in the open. They had no further reason to question the loyalty of these individuals.

They added that STANLEY DRAPKIN had described his brother, LEONARD DRAPKIN, as a Communist.

ARONS and RACHLIN advised that the following people were unknown to them:

STANLEY C. MURRAY
NAT PITASHNICK
LOUIS SELIGSON /

Mrs. BARUCH stated she came to the FBT in order to obtain "corroborative information" regarding the people name as possible Communist sympathizers. It also appears that she was trying to head off any possible adverse publicity regarding the AFDCI.

ARONS and RACHLIN originally made the allegation that people with possible Communist sympathies were employed by the AFDCI. They now advise that these people have eased out by the AFDCI and that Communism has no influence on the AFDCI. Therefore, this case is being closed.





The directory in the lobby of the building at 215 Fourth Ave., NYC, reflects that Suite 1500 at that address is occupied by the American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel (Bufile 97-3038.)

For Pittsburgh's information, the records of CSNY-1 reflect that the American Financial and Development Corporation for Israel was incorporated under NY laws on 12/21/50 for the purpose of selling \$500,000,000 worth of bonds for the State of Israel. In the prospectus published by the AFDCI under date of 3/28/51 it was indicated that an agreement would be entered into prior to 5/1/51 between the State of Israel and the AFDCI for the sale of Israeli Government bonds. This prospectus also related that all of the stock of the AFBCI is owned by the American Committee for Aid to Israeli Immigrants, a non profit corporation organized under the laws of the state of New Jersey. Investigation of this organization revealed that it is a corporation not organized for gains or individual profit and that no dividends shall ever be declared or paid to any of its members. All income of this corporation beyond that necessary to carry out its progress and any surplus remaining upon dissolution is to be transferred to such organizations which are devoted to the relief and rehabilitation of refugees in the State of Israel as may be designated by the Board of Trustees.

It is noted that Pittsburgh was furnished with copies of NY letters to the Bureau of 1/5/53 and 3/26/53 in the case entitled "COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF AMERICAN FINANCIAL AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF ISRAEL; IS-C."

No additional information re subject was located in the indices of the NYO other than that which is already in possession of the Pittsburgh Office. RUC.
