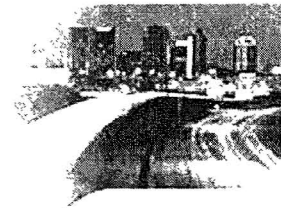

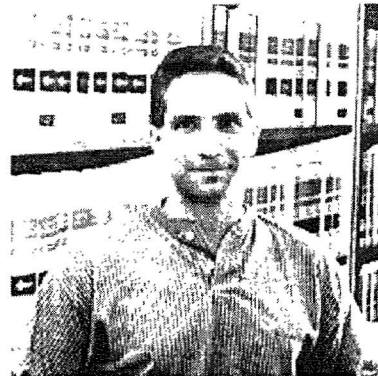

Profile of Presenter:

Dr. Randy Borum regularly conducts risk assessment training and is author/co-author of numerous publications on violence risk assessment, including the Structured Assessment of Violence Risk in Youth, a guided clinical assessment instrument currently under development. Dr. Borum is a consultant to the U.S. Secret Service, in the National Threat Assessment Center where he worked on the Safe School Initiative and Advisory Board Member for the FBI's Behavioral Science Unit. He is currently Associate Professor in the Department of Mental Health Law & Policy at the Louis de la Parte Florida Mental Health Institute, University of South Florida, where he also holds appointments in the Department of Criminology and the College of Public Health. Dr. Borum is a licensed psychologist and is Board-Certified (ABPP) and fellowship-trained in Forensic Psychology. He currently serves as Vice-President of the American Academy of Forensic Psychology.

Keynote Speaker

Jack McDevitt is Associate Dean for Graduate Studies and Research, Director of the Center for Criminal Justice Policy Research and an Assistant Professor in Northeastern University's College of Criminal Justice. He has been teaching and conducting research at the Center for the past 19 years.



In 1989 he authored the first study of hate motivated violence which became the basis of Hate Crime: The Rising Tide of Bigotry and Bloodshed co-authored with Jack Levin. He also authored the first national report on hate crime: The 1990 Hate Crime Resource Book for the FBI. As a result of this research, he developed and is co-director of Northeastern University's Civil Rights Certificate Training program.

Mr. McDevitt has testified as an expert witness before the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee and the U.S. Civil Rights Commission and has served as a consultant to the FBI, the Bureau of Justice Statistics, the Governor and Attorney General of Massachusetts and numerous local law enforcement agencies. He has appeared in numerous media and publications including The New York Times, The MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour, The Today Show, The Boston Globe, The Chronicle of Higher Education and many others.

PRESENTERS

David Barkey is the Midwest Civil Rights Counsel of the Anti-Defamation League. Prior to joining the ADL, Mr. Barkey served as a trial attorney at the New York Office of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission where he specialized in federal employment discrimination litigation. From 1997 to 1998, Mr. Barkey was an associate at the law firm of Jackson, Lewis, Schnitzler & Krupman where he specialized in labor and employment law. Mr. Barkey received his J.D. from Brooklyn Law School.

Randy Borum is a doctor of psychology and an associate professor with the Department of Mental Health Law and Policy, Louis de la Parte Florida Mental Health Institute, University of South Florida, Tampa. An adjunct assistant professor of medical psychology at the School of Medicine, Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, he has also provided threat assessment training, research, and technical assistance for the United States Secret Service and served as a member of the forensic psychology advisory board of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Dorothy Capers is the Supervisor of the Cook County State's Attorney's Office's (CCSAO) Community Prosecutions Division, forging partnerships with City and County Municipal offices, community groups, schools and religious groups to collectively take a "grass roots" approach to the resolution of community crime issues and concerns. Ms. Capers worked for the CCSAO as an Assistant State's Attorney in both the First Municipal District prosecuting misdemeanors and as a felony prosecutor in the Felony Trial Division. She is a member of the American, National, Illinois State, Chicago and Cook County Bar Associations.

Richard Hirschhaut has served as the Director of the ADL's Upper/Regional Office since 1993, having previously served as the Director of ADL's Central Pacific Regional Office, based in San Francisco. He is a regular consultant to law enforcement agencies, municipalities, and professional associations on issues of extremism and the impact of hate crimes. In 1999 Mr. Hirschhaut was appointed by Illinois Governor George Ryan to serve as a founding member of the Governor's Commission on Discrimination and Hate Crimes.

Greg Hug is a Sergeant with the Missouri State Highway Patrol. A native of South St. Louis, Missouri, Sgt. Hug began his service in 1974, after receiving an honorable discharge from the U.S. Marine Corps. He has spent over twenty years assigned to the Criminal Investigations, Narcotics and Organized Crime Units of the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

James Keathley has been employed by the Missouri State Highway Patrol (MSHP) since 1977, and was promoted to Captain in 1994. While employed at MSHP, Captain Keathley has coordinated several extremist investigations, including a large common law court investigation; patriot-for-profit fraud schemes; the shooting of Corporal Bobby Harper; the planned attack on Fort Hood, Texas; and the kidnapping of several children by a Christian Identity church. Capt. Keathley is a nationwide instructor on extremist criminal activities and has provided instruction on extremism at the Domestic Terrorism Awareness Judicial Conference, the Missouri State Emergency Management Conference, the St. Louis Area Police Chiefs Conference, and the Missouri Prosecutor's Association.

Joy Repella is a felony prosecutor for the Cook County State's Attorney's Office where she litigates trials, including hate crimes. She has been with the Community Prosecutions Division since January 1999. She participates in problem solving and community policing, and partners with police, civic leaders and local residents at District Advisory Committee, Beat, and other community meetings. Ms. Repella trains teachers, court advocates, and service providers on the law and the court system.

Shahna Richman serves as a Special Agent with the FBI, and has been a law enforcement officer for ten years. She joined the ranks of the FBI in 1996 after obtaining her Master's Degree in Forensic Science, and is currently assigned to the FBI Chicago Domestic Terrorism Squad.

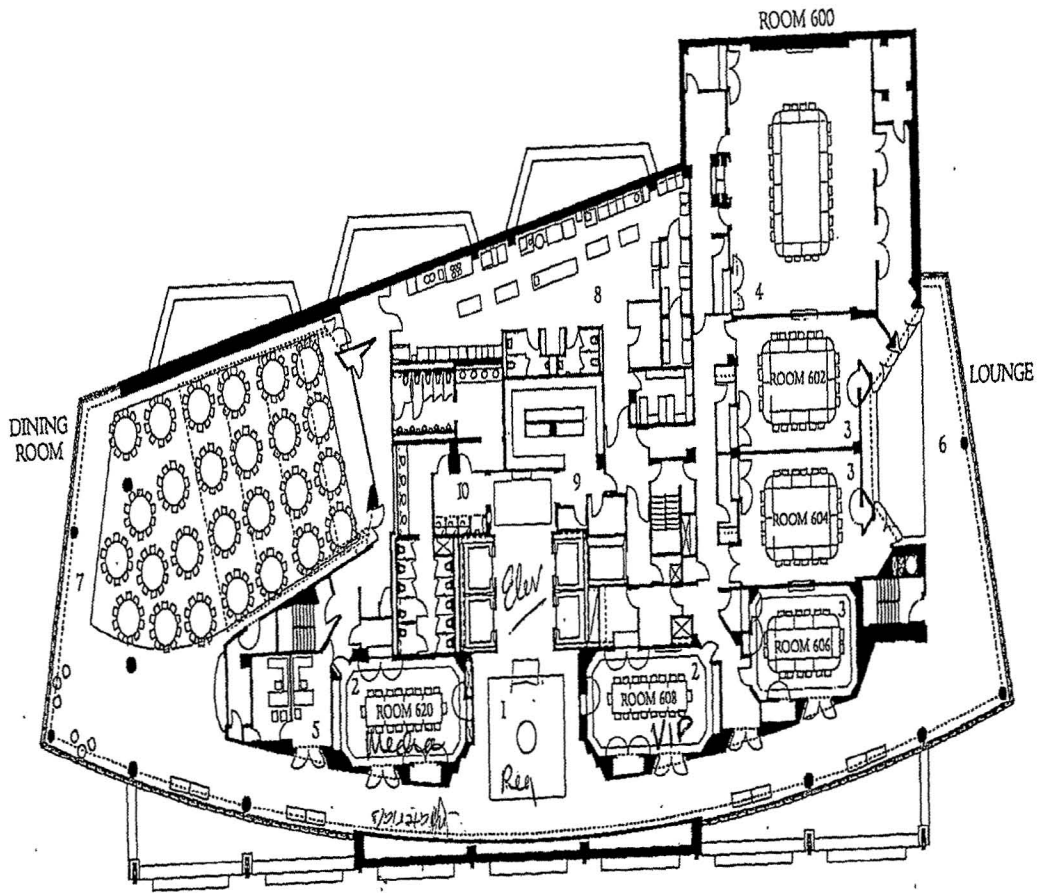
Barry Silverberg is a Captain with the Skokie, Illinois Police Department, where he has served since 1976. Capt. Silverberg's experience with hate crime began in 1976, when, as a rookie officer, he became involved in his department's response to the American Nazi Party's attempt to rally there. He has continued his commitment to fighting hate crime through his community service efforts and continued dedication in the investigation of extremist offenses.

Gail Stern has served as the Midwest Director of Fact Finding and Training for the Anti-Defamation League since October 1999. She previously served as the director of the University of Illinois at Chicago Campus Advocacy Network from 1991-1998, supporting victims of rape, domestic violence, and hate crime. Ms. Stern is a member of the Department of Justice and Federal Law Enforcement Training Center Hate and Bias Crime training teams, and trains law enforcement nationally on issues related to hate and extremism.

Thomas Van Nuys serves as a Supervisory Special Agent with the FBI, and is the current supervisor of the FBI Chicago Domestic Terrorism Squad. After obtaining his Juris Doctorate, Tom joined the ranks of the FBI in 1988 and has been involved in the FBI Terrorism program since that time.

C.K. Wakefield is a Sergeant with the Missouri State Highway Patrol. He has served the MSHP since 1980, and has spent over 11 years assigned to the Narcotics and Organized Crime Units.

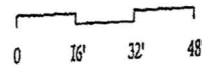

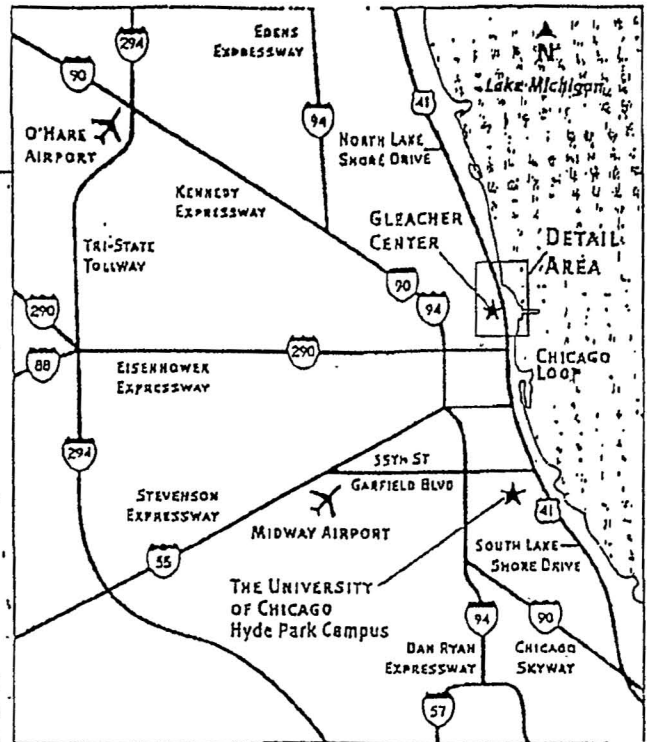
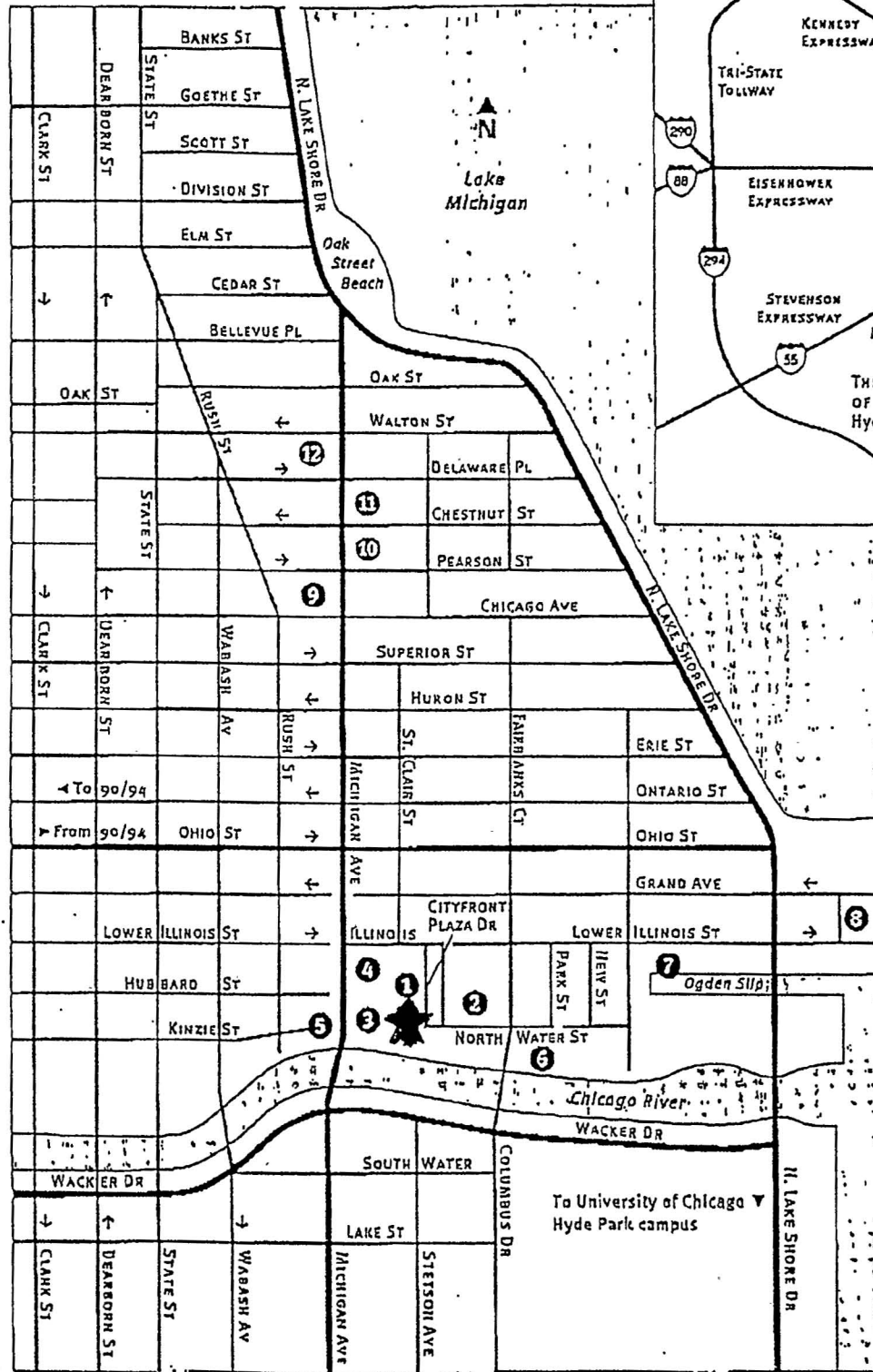
SIXTH FLOOR PLAN
